TROJANS CLUB HOUSE FUNDRAISING

Trojans has made huge progress towards replacing our ageing clubhouse, acquiring full planning permission for a purpose-built clubhouse catering for all of our sports – new changing rooms, social spaces, and amazing viewing balconies overlooking the pitches.

We have also secured material funding of around £1 million from local authorities, sporting national governing bodies and other sources, and have had positive indicators about the availability of significant commercial borrowing.

If you have been to the club recently you cannot fail to notice the amazing new padel tennis facility which is providing a new long-term external income stream. This is one of several new facilities built or planned which will provide significant new ongoing revenue.

The clubhouse development is a critical part of our plan to ensure we are the leading multi-sports centre in the south for the next 50+ years. Ideally, we would want to be able to break ground by mid 2025, but certainly won't be able to do that without support from members - past and present or other friends of the club.

This document outlines the ways in which you can help fund this project. Your support is fundamental to the future of the club and what clubhouse facilities we have in the future.

CLUBHOUSE COSTS & FUNDING STATUS

We are currently reviewing tender estimates from a number of interested parties for the proposed design, and with an estimated build cost of £2,000 per square meter, the planned new clubhouse would cost between £2-3 million, depending upon the funds available to us, and the final design.

Whilst we will be taking up offers to work with sponsors to reduce costs, e.g. providing materials at very competitive rates, we still need to secure more grants, and to fundraise through our membership.

Now is the appropriate time to make that request and to find out what funds we can realistically raise from members.

We are likely to need a commercial loan, however the cost and risk of borrowing from a commercial bank is a very significant consideration and it might not bridge our gap.

WHAT CAN YOU DO?



Everyone's personal circumstances and relationship with the club is different and therefore we have proposed 3 different packages intended to suit everyone. Every £1 moves us closer to realising our ambition.

The packages are set out below:

- **Bronze:** those making total donations to the club of up to £1,500 (including recurring payments)
- **Silver:** those making donations or loans to the club of between £1,500 and £10,000
- **Gold:** those making significant donations or loans to the club of £10,000 or above.

In terms of return we have to be mindful of possible tax and legal considerations as well as affordability. We believe those outlined below are without issue and certainly in terms of larger sums we are open to your suggestions of what would work for you.

We are getting further guidance and financial advice to ensure that your generous contributions are invested as effectively as possible, and that all loans are administered properly.

Alan was very much part of the club throughout most of his life and although he sadly passed away before the beginning of the planned improvement of the club, we his family know that if he were alive he would have contributed more than just money to the process and he would be incredibly proud to see the development take place.

As a result of his love of watching hockey it will be fabulous to see his name adorning the balcony overlooking the hockey pitch.

We are aware that not everyone has the ability to donate or lend significant sums, but still want to be involved. We have highlighted 3 outline packages that you can contribute through to help us deliver the new clubhouse. If you wish to invest a larger amount, or a smaller, different type of contribution please get in touch.

We are now sending out this fundraising document to members past and present, and are looking to get a genuine indication of your potential involvement by the Spring. By this date we should also have progressed the build process to a point where we have a more accurate cost with some potential options for phasing, and other ways to reduce the initial capital outlay.

We are also aiming to have advanced some additional grant funding applications and to have a clearer picture of all external funding opportunities that realistically exist. Once we have these build costs, member fundraising levels, and further external funding options, we will aim to present the full package back to members, with some options including a preferred option for a decision at an extra-ordinary meeting of the members.

Core to this would be a genuine indication of commitment to support this fundraising, and the level of involvement that you would be willing to make. So please take time to think about how you could support the future of our club.

The core message is that any money given or invested is an investment in the future of the club, and that you can be a pivotal part of a community of people developing sport and friendship opportunities for future generations.
